2023 Program Announcement

The Howard Hughes Medical Institute (HHMI) is pleased to announce the 2023 Hanna H. Gray Fellows Program competition. This program seeks to increase diversity in biomedical science by recruiting and retaining individuals from groups currently underrepresented in the life sciences, as HHMI works to foster inclusive research environments in which all scientists thrive. Fellows receive funding for their postdoctoral training and may continue to receive funding during their early career years as independent faculty. They join HHMI's growing community of scientists and participate in professional development. The Institute will select and support up to 25 fellows in this competition. This grant competition is open to all eligible applicants and no nomination is required. Applications are due December 7, 2022.

Eligibility

- are from gender, racial, ethnic, and other groups underrepresented in the life sciences, including those individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds. This includes, but is not limited to, women of any ethnic or racial group as well as any individual identifying as Hispanic or Latinx, Black, Native Hawaiian / Pacific Islander, or American Indian / Alaska Native.
- hold a PhD and/or MD (or equivalent), which must be conferred by the start of the grant term.
 - » U.S. citizens must have a degree from a research institution in the U.S. (including Puerto Rico) or an international research institution.
 - » Non-U.S. citizen and applicants with other nationalities must have a degree from a research institution in the U.S. (including Puerto Rico).
- have no more than 18 months of postdoctoral research experience at the time of the application due date.

Grants in support of fellows will be awarded only to institutions within the U.S. (including Puerto Rico).

Applications are due on December 7, 2022. Mentor and reference letters must be received by December 14, 2022.
